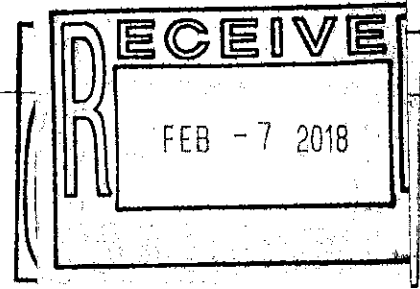

Dear Brian:

As a matter of general interest, the Postal Service plans to solicit select annuitants to serve as temporary non-career Postmasters Relief (PMRs) during the upcoming February 2018 rural mail count.

Former employees who were members of the rural carrier, city carrier, and clerk crafts will be eligible to participate. The term of service for annuitants who are selected to participate will begin February 24 and end March 9.

We have enclosed a copy of the letter that will be sent to eligible annuitants concerning this matter. The subject letter is scheduled to be distributed later this week.

Dear Postal Annuitant:

We want to make you aware of a special short-term employment opportunity with the United States Postal Service as a temporary non-career Postmaster Relief (PMR). The Postal Service is seeking to reemploy annuitants for these short-term positions during the upcoming February 2018 rural mail count.

During the month of February we will conduct a national rural route mail count. The count will be conducted for 14 days beginning February 24 and ending March 9, 2018. Since a large number of routes will be counted and it is only for a short period of time, your Postal knowledge and skills would be beneficial.

Generally, the law requires that the salary of a reemployed annuitant be reduced, or offset, by the amount of the annuity to prevent payment/receipt of dual compensation. However, under certain conditions, retired postal employees are eligible for a waiver to the offset requirement when they are reemployed into a non-career PMR position.

Terms and conditions:

- Pay rate is established at \$19.78 per hour.
- Appointments will expire March 9, 2018.
- You will be subject to screening: a criminal conviction search and pre-employment drug test are required (unless your retirement effective date was in the past 90 days).

PMR's counting mail will be required to report for a training session scheduled locally during the week of February 20 and count mail up to 6 days a week at an assigned office beginning February 24. The mail count work will be performed beginning early mornings for up to 6 hours per day.

If you are interested in reemployment with the Postal Service as a PMR without reduction to the amount of salary that you receive as an annuitant, please apply online at www.usps.com/employment. You'll search for "PM Relief (Annuitant)" where you are available to work and apply for this noncompetitive employment opportunity. The postings will be available from February 5 - 12. In the summary of accomplishments you should list the Office(s) where you are interested in serving as a mail counter (city, state, zip).

Whether or not you choose to apply for reemployment as a temporary PMR, we thank you for your years of service to our customers in the past, and we wish you and your family a safe and happy 2018.
