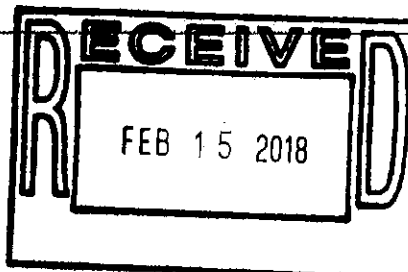

STAND UP TALK

Sunday – Priority Package Delivery

The Postal Service is currently expanding the sortation and delivery of Priority Mail packages on Sundays and Holidays. Delivering network Priority Mail at existing Sunday hub offices provides opportunity to gain competitive advantage and revenue. This allows our customers to expand to 7 day delivery options as well as providing opportunity to level our workloads on Mondays. Delivery began in the Arizona District on July 9 and has now expanded to 20 plants and 341 Sunday Delivery Hubs nationally, representing approximately 15% of existing hub offices.

Special sort plans have been created enabling P&DCs to process available destinating Monday committed Priority Mail on Saturday night/Sunday morning. Packages are machinable and non-machinable Priority Mail with First Class parcels being separated out when possible.

Delivery Hub units are processing and delivering Priority Mail with our Same Day Product, utilizing non-career staffing. Additional Mobile Delivery Devices (MDDs), are being provisioned with Co-Pilot software to utilize Turn-by-Turn instructions on all Sunday delivery routes. Parcels are to be delivered to the door and scanning integrity remains paramount. Delivery expectations for Same Day Product and service standards on Priority Mail are still required.

Headquarters continues to analyze technological capabilities, processing capacities, operational requirements, potential benefits and costs associated with delivery of network Priority Mail on Sundays and Holidays to refine the process. Processing plants and all current Sunday hub offices are continuously being reviewed with plans to expand the Sunday Priority Mail package delivery in the upcoming months.
