

SUBJECT: Welcome to LEADing Together!

Thank you for your dedication to our customers, and in all you do to serve our nation. I'm very excited to share with you details of our new LEADing Together lead-generation program, which will help us serve our customers—particularly our small business customers—even better.

As described by Postmaster General Louis DeJoy in his introductory letter, LEADing Together is a one-stop program that lets you enter customer leads. You can also follow your submitted leads online as they progress through the sales process.

While on the clock, all employees are encouraged to talk to local small businesses about the value of USPS mailing and shipping services and ask if a salesperson can contact them to explain the details. If the customer approves, submit a lead through the LEADing Together portal.

To ensure all employees can participate and follow their leads, you can access the LEADing Together portal in several different ways.

- For carriers using the mobile delivery device (MDD scanner): While on street mode, use
 option "U" or Lead Card.
- For those with access to the USPS network through a postal computer, smartphone or other mobile device: Click on the LEADing Together link on the Blue page under the "Featured Topics" section or through the "Connecting with Customers" Blue page.
- For those without access to a postal computer, smartphone or other mobile device: Click
 on the LEADing Together link on the main page of the employee website LiteBlue
 (<u>liteblue.usps.gov</u>) under the featured topics tab. You will need your 8-digit employee ID
 number to log on.
- For C360 users: Access the LEADing Together site through the platform under the "my tools" section.

A paper lead card can still be completed manually and provided to your supervisor or manager to enter for you.
