ORDER

Upon consideration of the parties' Proposed Written Discovery Plan and Proposed Scheduling Order (the "Discovery Plan"), and the entire record herein, it is this 8th day of Sept 2023,

ORDERED that, in accordance with the Court's order dated August 15, 2023, each side shall be permitted 15 document requests, 15 interrogatories, and 15 requests for admission, with initial requests and initial interrogatories by each party to be served within 21 days of this Order and with written discovery to be completed within 90 days of this Order; and that the parties meet for a conference regarding the Postal Service's electronically stored information (ESI) [~~before~~] after the Postal Supervisors propound their initial requests for documents. A technical representative for the Postal Service [~~should~~] let [may at the Postal Service's discretion] participate in that conference.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall file a joint status report on or before November 9, 2023, in which they will propose a schedule for the disclosure of any witnesses as described in paragraph 2 of the Discovery Plan, as well as any additional discovery applicable to such disclosures, and to address any other scheduling issues concerning discovery that may have

arisen by that time.
