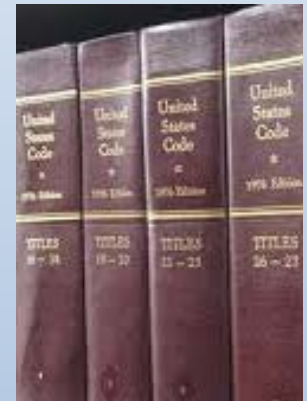
Congressional Authority Over Postal Operations

Article 1 Section 8 of the U.S. Constitution
empowers Congress "To establish Post Offices and
Post Roads"

39 United States Code §101

“The United States Postal Service shall be operated as a basic and fundamental service provided to the people by the Government of the United States, authorized by the Constitution, created by Act of Congress, and supported by the people.”

“The Postal Service shall have as its basic function the obligation to provide postal services to bind the Nation together through the personal, educational, literary, and business correspondence of the people. It shall provide prompt, reliable, and efficient services to patrons in all areas and shall render postal services to all communities.”



39 United States Code §201



- The Postal Service is as “an independent establishment of the executive branch”
- Such an establishment, with its legal governance and regulatory structure, cannot be abducted by another federal agency

39 United States Code §202



- The USPS’ authority rests with its 11-member presidentially nominated Senate conformed Board of Governors
- The Postmaster General and Deputy Postmaster General serve at the pleasure of the Board of Governors
- Each Postal Board of Governor serves a 7-year term and “may be removed only for cause.”

Protect Health and Retirement Benefits

- \$50 billion in cuts assumed in H.Con.Res 14, the House-passed Budget Resolution
- Among cut options suggested by House Ways and Means Committee
 - Increase employee withholding for FERS annuity
 - Recalculate FERS retirement to be based on high-5, rather than the current high-3 salaried years
 - Replace the 72% of the weighted average premium for calculating employee share of health premium to a voucher plan



Postal Supervisors, Managers & Postmasters Need Fairness

Support H.R. 1560

- Avoids lengthy and costly litigation, and promotes fairness
 - Sensible schedule to resolve pay and benefits issues
 - Expert FMCS recommendations would be binding
- 2019: FMCS Fact-Finding Panel
 - Unanimously concluded USPS violated law
 - Made recommendations. USPS ignored recommendations.
- 2022: US Court of Appeals for DC Circuit
 - Unanimously ruled USPS violated law. Remanded to District Court to determine damages.




Postal Managers Due Process!

Support H.R. 1559

- Extends MSPB equity to all EAS level postal employees
- More than 4,000 postal managers are denied the right to appeal adverse decision to MSPB
 - Most work in USPS HQ positions
- Postal managers must rely on unfair internal USPS review system

Protect Postal Personnel, Assets and Mail: Support H.R. 2095

- Restore USPS Police authority to protect personnel, property and mail
- In 2020, USPS restricted police to USPS facilities
 - Letter carrier robberies increased 863%
 - Mail theft increased 146%
- Postal Police Visibility Deters Crime
 - In LA by 60%
 - In DC by 66%

ASSAULT OF POSTAL EMPLOYEE AND THEFT OF POSTAL VEHICLE



The U.S. Postal Inspection Service is offering a reward of up to \$50,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the suspect who assaulted a Letter Carrier and stole a USPS vehicle.

The assault of the Letter Carrier and theft of the Postal vehicle occurred at approximately 9:20 a.m. on October 22, 2022 at the 2000 block of S. Putaski Rd., Chicago, IL 60623. The vehicle was recovered in the 4500 block of W. Marquette Rd, Chicago, IL 60629.

The suspect is described as a Hispanic male, approximately 40-49 years old, short hair, wearing a light colored sleeveless shirt, dark jeans, and black shoes, multiple arm and chest tattoos and a tattoo on the side of head. Suspect is considered armed and dangerous.

Retirement COLA Equality

- Social Security and Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) annuities are adjusted annually based by the consumer price index (CPI-W)
- Federal Employee Retirement System (FERS) annuitants receive a reduced COLA if CPI is greater than 2%
 - If the CPI is 2-3%, the FERS COLA is frozen at 2%
 - If the CPI is >3%, the FERS COLA is CPI minus 1%
- HR 491 and S 624 would treat the FERS annuity the same as SS and CSRS



USPS Board of Governors

- Nominated by President and confirmed by Senate
- 3 Current Board vacancies
- Nominees must be qualified
- Nominees must be committed to universal service, accessibility, and quality performance
