Board Memo 069-2023: Update on Mercury Spill in Las Vegas

Executive Board,

Below is an update on the mercury spill in Las Vegas.

6/17/2023: Las Vegas Mercury Spill update, information per USPS Industrial Hygienist Brandon Henderson

The next update will be Sunday June 18th unless conditions warrant otherwise.

Las Vegas PSA (Henderson)

- Contractor ran a 4-hour study of breathing zones around expansion joints that had elevated levels on 6-16.
 - Results came back within Postal criteria.
- USPS maintenance was able to open the SIPS 2 and replace the belt on Friday June 16th. Once the belt was successfully replaced, the machine was run.
 - Once machine was run, <u>contractors found additional hotspots</u> inside the machine that were previously inaccessible visually and by instrumentation.
 - All readings prior to starting up the SIPS were within Postal criteria.
 - Contractors believe mercury is trapped within the intake portion of the conveyor.
- Contractors will build a containment around the intake portion of the SIPS 2 and continue heating/venting the area to promote off-gassing of any remaining mercury.
 - After the containment has been heated and vented, contractors will take readings and attempt to decontaminate accessible surfaces, then repeat the process.
 - Contractor states one heating/ventilation cycle will take up to **5 hours.**
- Contractors have proposed the following tentative outline of activities over the next few days:
 - Saturday, June 17
 - Acquire materials and build a containment around the SIPS 2 intake portion of the machine.
 - Heat and vent the interior of the containment.
 - Day shift personnel will attempt to complete one full cycle after building containment.
 - Overnight shift will continue heating and venting process throughout the night.
 - Sunday, June 18
 - Continue heating, venting, and cleaning cycles throughout the day and night or until toxicologist confirms mercury levels have sufficiently dropped.
 - Monday, June 19

- If the levels have sufficiently dropped, contractors will remove containment and prepare for final clearance.
- If levels have showed a downward trend but have not reached acceptable levels, contractors will continue the heating/ventilation process.
- If levels are not showing a downward trend, contractors will obtain guidance from USPS and look into other remediation efforts.
- o Tuesday, June 20
 - Activities on this day are dependent upon the steps taken on June 19
 - If levels sufficiently dropped, contractors would obtain analytical clearance and take steps to reopening the facility.
 - If levels were showing downward trend, contractors will reassess readings and will obtain USPS guidance regarding continuing or ceasing the heating/venting process and possibly investigate other remediation efforts.
