The Postal Service's Role in the Election Process

The U.S. Postal Service is responsible for processing, transporting, and delivering the nation's Election Mail.

The Postal Service is committed to fulfilling our role in the electoral process when public policy makers choose to utilize the mail as a part of their election system.

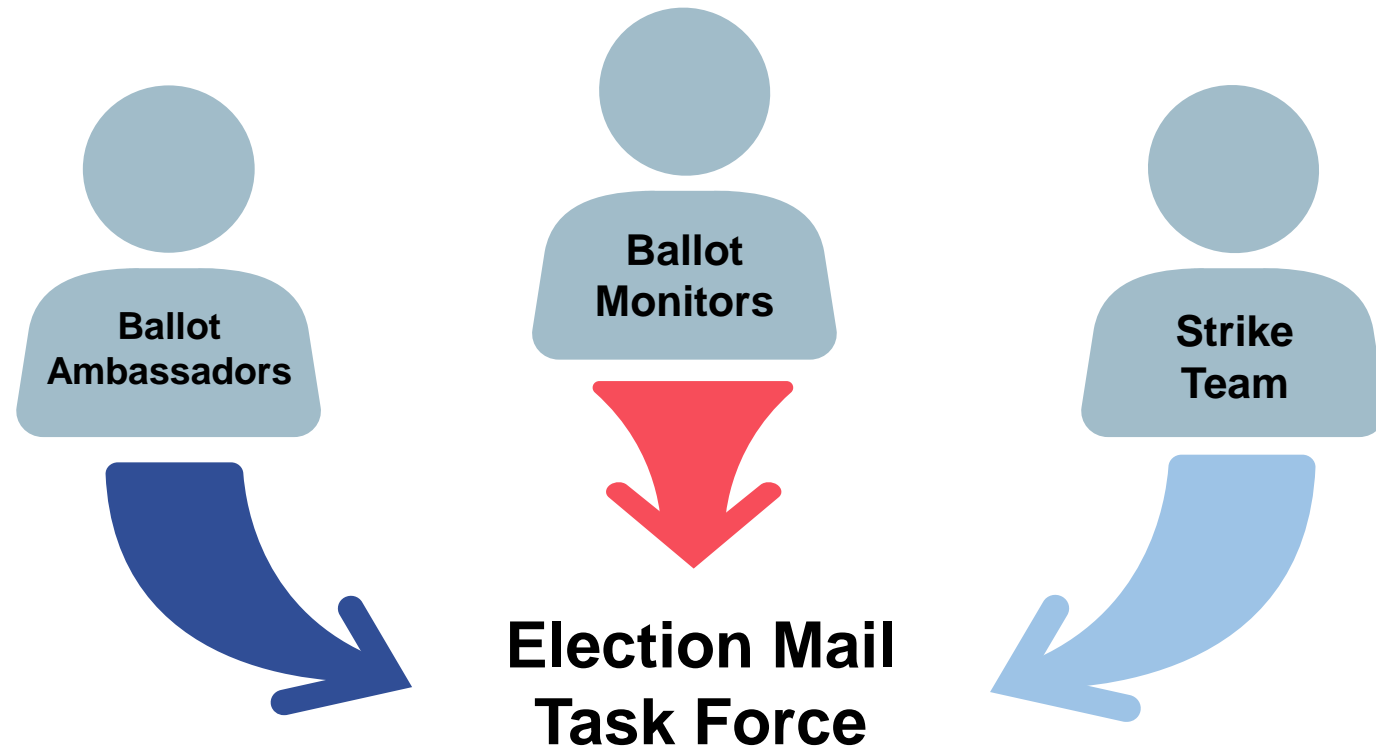
We are proud to provide a secure, efficient, and effective way for citizens to participate in elections when election officials choose to use the mail as part of the voting process.

We employ a robust and proven process to ensure proper handling of all Election Mail, including ballots.

National Election Mail Task Force

Election Mail Task Force Goal

The USPS program is intended to leverage resources to champion election mail awareness and execute policies and procedures.



Strike Teams

Cross functional teams consisting of HQ, Area, District/Division EAS employees.

District and Division Coordinators are part of the strike team. They will coordinate and have oversight over their respective District/Division.

Ballot Ambassadors

Consist of EAS employees who are designated by their group's leadership.

Role: Champion and drive election mail awareness. Ensure policies are followed.

CRDO

- One ballot ambassador designated per office that services an election office
- One EAS District Coordinator per district designated by District leadership

CPDO

- One ballot ambassador per facility (to match facility coordinator role)
- One EAS Division Coordinator designated by Division leadership

CRDO Ballot Monitor Roles

Consists of craft employees, district leadership and unions will partner to select/designate ballot monitors.

Role: Escalate issues, suggestions and/or feedback to local leadership. Champion and drive election mail awareness.

CRDO

- Union needs to work with District Leadership to designate monitors
- One ballot monitor from every postal facility that services an election office
- Escalate challenges/opportunities to EAS ballot ambassador and/or EAS District Coordinator
- No OT or travel is required

CPDO Ballot Monitor Role

Consists of craft employees, plant leadership and unions will partner to select/designate ballot monitors.

Role: Escalate issues, suggestions and/or feedback to local leadership. Champion and Drive election mail awareness.

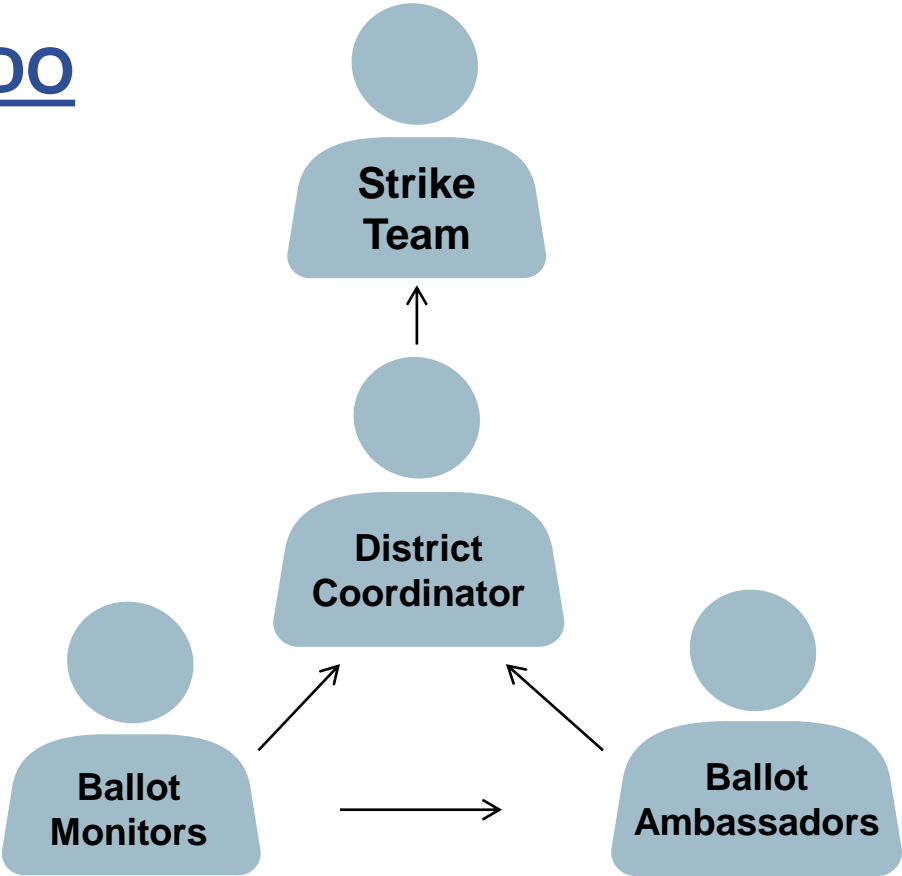
CPDO

- Union needs to work with plant Leadership to designate monitors
- One ballot monitor per tour on facilities processing Letters and Flats only.
- Reports to facility's ballot ambassador
- Escalate challenges/opportunities to EAS ballot ambassador and/or EAS Division Coordinator
- No OT or travel is required

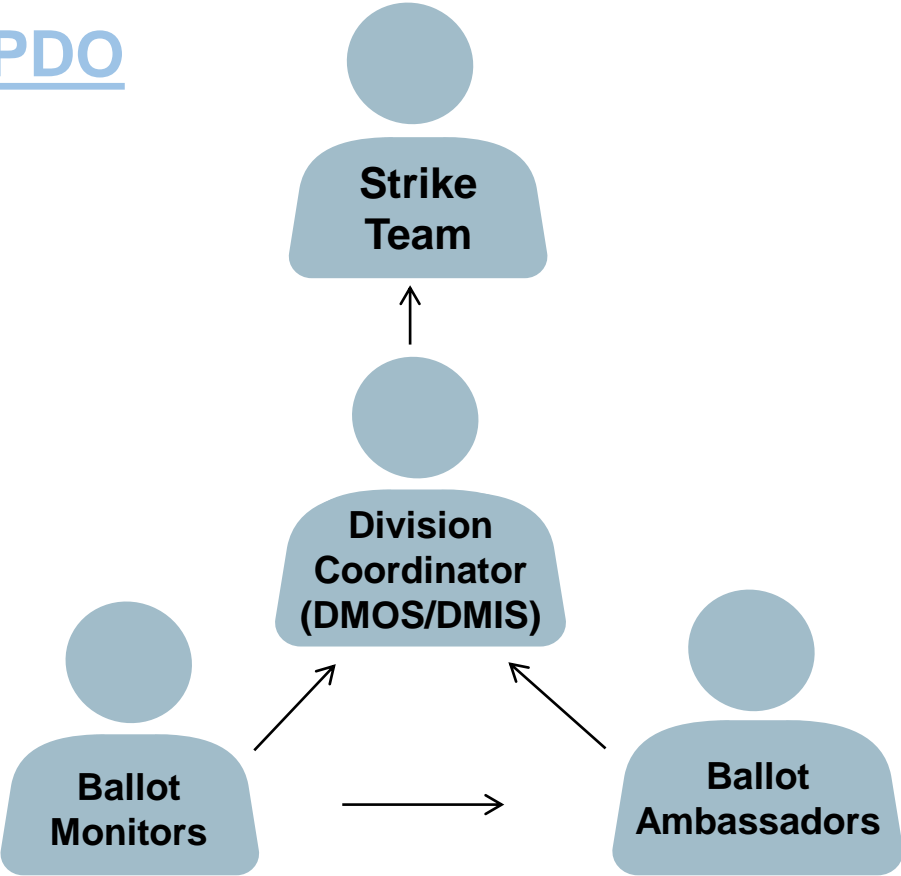
Election & Gov Mail Task Force Chain

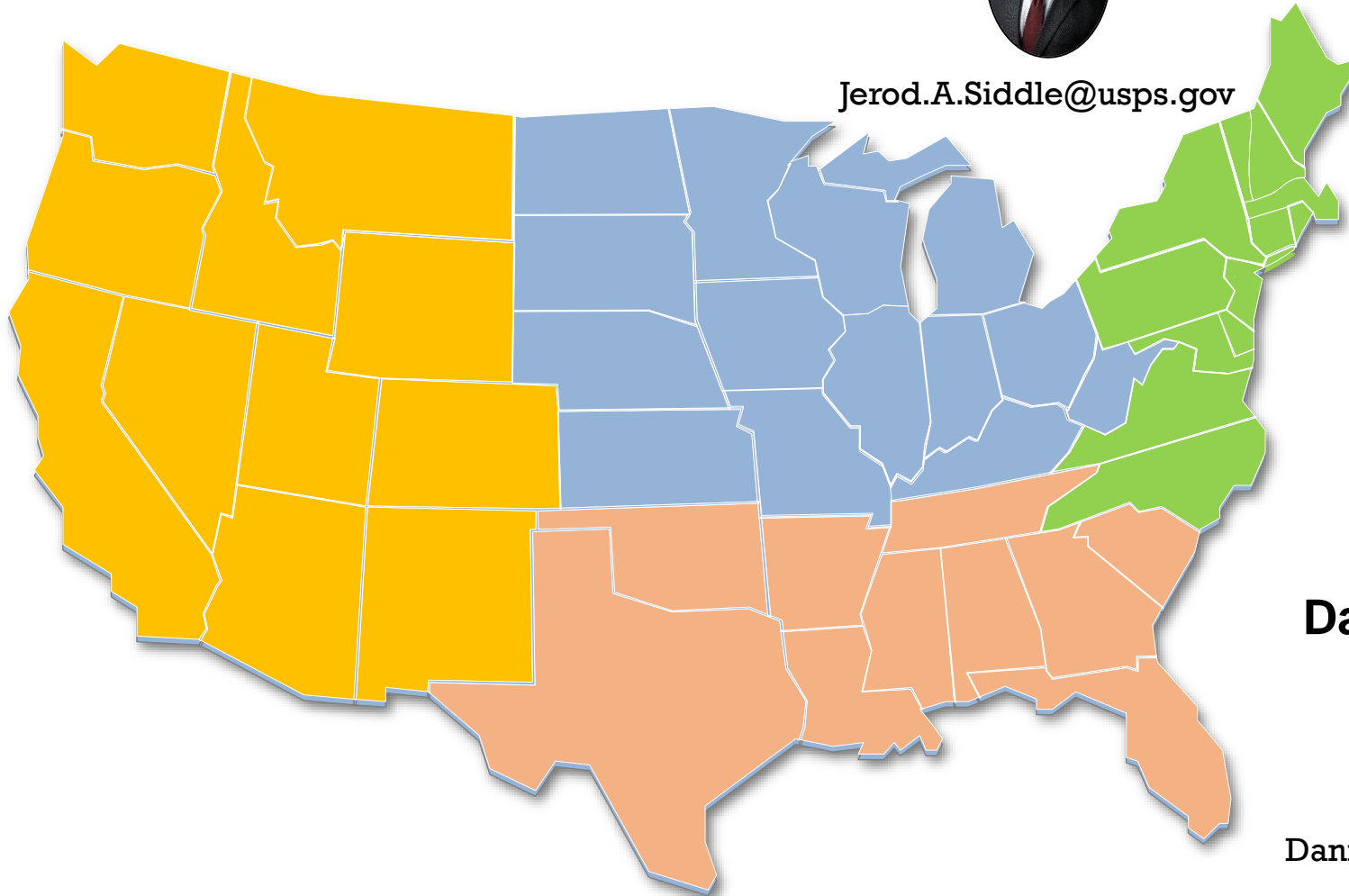

- Task force ends: November 15, 2024

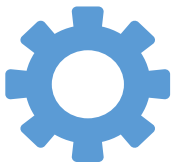
National Election Mail Task Force Summary
