This letter is follow-up to the Postal Service's most recent correspondence dated June 14 (enclosed), regarding the development of a new Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) to replace the Electronic Maintenance Reporting and Scheduling (eMARS) system that is currently being used.

As previously informed, the new system will provide a more detailed description of the daily tasks maintenance personnel perform to include work orders, equipment records, preventative maintenance, inventory, workload scheduling, and reactive maintenance. The Postal Service plans to conduct observations, interviews, surveys and focus groups with craft and Executive and Administrative Scheduled (EAS) employees in maintenance operations.

The observations are scheduled to be conducted as follows:

- Denver, Colorado National Distribution Center (NDC) and Processing and Distribution Center (P&DC) on October 3 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm mountain standard time;
- Southern Maryland P&DC and Washington, DC NDC on October 10 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm eastern standard time;
- Austin, Texas PDC and Annex on October 17 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm central standard time.
