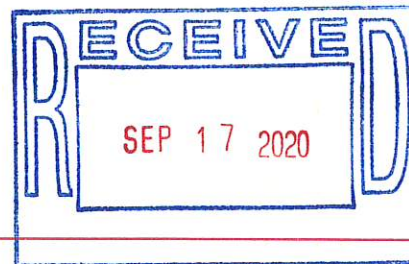

Dear Mr. Wagner:

This is in further reference to our December 4, 2019, notice concerning the Postal Service's intention to test the use of GeoTab telematics technology in postal owned vehicles in the Richmond District.

After assessing the information of the previous phase of this test, the Postal Service has determined that there is significant opportunity to reduce fuel consumption. Long engine idle times, aggressive acceleration and speeding have shown to be contributing factors to a vehicle's fuel economy. Advancements in telematics technology has given us the tools to identify situations where a vehicle is showing poor fuel economy and where we have opportunities to improve fuel consumption.

To achieve this, the Postal Service will be providing vehicle scorecards based on the frequency of the above identified factors. The scorecards will be available for all operators to view without identifying the actual driver. The focus will be on the vehicles with the best fuel economy in an effort to positively reinforce the need to promote good driving habits.

The scorecards will be limited to the Richmond Motor Vehicle Service (MVS) group consisting of 29 PVS vehicles (19 Cargo Vans, 9 Tractors and 1 Spotter).

This phase of the test is expected to begin September 28, and run through December 31.
