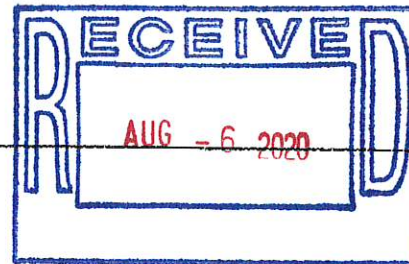

Dear Brian:

As a matter of general interest, the Postal Service will be testing Proof of Delivery enhancement to the Mobile Delivery Device (MDD).

The purposes of this test is to assist in the identification of the Proof of Delivery. This feature will allow the carrier to capture an image of the actual location where a package was placed when the delivery was made.

The test is tentatively scheduled to begin August 8 and run for approximately 90 days in the following locations in the Capital District:

- Section 2 Carrier Annex – ZIP Code 20002
- Section 1 Carrier Annex – ZIP Code 20001
- Anacostia Carrier Annex – ZIP Code 20020
- Congress Heights Station – ZIP Code 20032
- River Terrace Carrier Annex – ZIP Code 20019

Enclosed is a draft copy of the Stand Up Talk - MDD Proof of Delivery (Pilot) to be used at the test sites.

Only one picture is allowed for the package(s) delivered in the same transaction location. The picture provides proof that the package has been delivered successfully to the correct location. The package(s) itself will only be visible for internal use during the pilot testing and stored on RIMS. The address on the package(s) if visible when the picture is taken, will be blurred out of the photo as seen below.

¹Personally Identifiable Information — PII

Just like you, every customer and employee shares information about themselves — like name and address — in work, personal, and business settings. Some information is common: many people are named John or Sally. Some information is unique, like a Social Security or employee identification number. Information that allows a person to be identified, contacted, or located is called Personally Identifiable Information or PII.

Tips

- Stand 5 feet away from the package.
- Remain steady and avoid camera shake when capturing an image.
- Be aware of the image's background; avoid Personally Identifiable Information¹ (PII).
