Dear Brian:

The Postal Service plans to pilot a program that will transfer oversight of the Tort Claims Coordinator (TCC) function to the Law Department at the General Law Service Center in St. Louis, MO. The purpose of the pilot is to determine whether transferring the oversight responsibility will improve the efficiency and effectiveness in the processing of tort claims.

The pilot will launch in Capital Metro Area and Southern Area on May 1, 2019 and continue for approximately 90-days.

The pilot will establish a temporary TCC Supervisor (EAS-21) assignment at the General Law Service Center. This assignment will oversee duties performed by current TCC's in the following Districts:

- Capital Metro Area – Capital, Atlanta, Baltimore, Greensboro, and Mid-Carolinas
- Southern Area – South Florida, Gulf Atlantic, Louisiana, Rio Grande, Houston, Dallas, and Suncoast

During the pilot, Tort Claim work of one district in each of the Areas will be absorbed by other districts' TCC.

- Capital Metro Area – Greater South Carolina's work will be split between Greensboro and Mid-Carolinas
- Southern Area – Alabama's work will be performed by Suncoast
