Dear Ivan:

This is a follow-up to the March 24, 2024, notice announcing the Project Canary software company would be working with the Postal Service by leasing space for its device designed to measure methane levels within the Denver Metro delivery area.

The Union was advised that the Project Canary pilot test will help determine if utility companies are interested in a data-rich heat map of possible gas leaks to make their systems safer and cleaner. Employee participation in the test consist of Vehicle Maintenance Facility (VMF) employees installing the devices onto our postal vehicles and city and rural carrier employees operating the vehicles during the performance of their regularly assigned street delivery duties. The initial pilot test involved the use of five delivery vehicles at the Indian Tree Station in Arvada, Colorado and scheduled to be conducted April 3, 2023. for a four-month period.


The Project Canary pilot test is being expanded to add an additional thirty (30) data collection devices on postal vehicles located at the following offices within the California 5 district:

- La Mirada, CA
- Pico Rivera, CA
- Whittier, CA

The pilot test is extended through March 2025.
